Treasurer Report

The Kalida Board of Education has strategically paid off the remaining \$2.2 million balance on the bond for the high school building 6.5 years early. The bond was set to expire December 2030, but due to the strong financial growth in the Kalida community, Kalida Board of Education seized the opportunity to pay off the bond early. The Kalida School District taxpayers should see an approximately \$115.50 reduction, per \$100,000 of assessed property value, starting in January 2025. This makes Kalida Schools debt free! The Kalida Board of Education appreciates our residents who have greatly supported our school system for so many years.


Free and Reduced Meal Applications
