



Kalida High School Announces New Scholarship

Kalida High School Principal Chris Pfahler and Guidance Counselor Jeff Clement are pleased to announce the *Margaret Holtkamp-Pizzurro Foundation Scholarship*.

Margaret Holtkamp-Pizzurro, who grew up and attended school in Kalida, often shared her fond memories of her school years. Margaret's family has established a scholarship in her honor as a way of conveying their gratitude to the community she was raised in and the school district responsible for her education. The fund is established in the hope of ensuring a brighter future to promising students who have demonstrated academic excellence and expressed a desire to pursue their education beyond high school and who are in need of financial assistance.

Born in 1924 to Edward and Mary Holtkamp, Margaret grew up in the heart of Kalida, enjoying the benefits of a loving family and a close-knit community. Before graduating from Kalida High School in 1942, she excelled at science and anything related to music. Margaret had a beautiful voice and was especially skilled on the piano. She graduated from Mary Manse College in Toledo in 1946 with a BA in Chemistry and went on to graduate with a Master's Degree in Biology from the University of Detroit in 1948; a notable achievement for a woman at that time. She abandoned her quest for a Ph.D. after falling in love with Joseph Pizzurro, the man she would eventually marry. Her new life swept Margaret to the New York City area to further Joseph's promising career and to start a family.

The next fifty years of Margaret's life were filled with family memories and charitable activities that cannot be captured in a few sentences. In a touching eulogy written by one of her sons after Margaret's passing in 2000, a portrait of Margaret Holtkamp-Pizzurro's life can be visualized through expressions of kindness, strength, grace and charm. Years later, as a loving tribute to the elegant 'Lady' in their lives, Joseph and the six children began the process of establishing this scholarship.

Initial contact was made with Kalida administrators in 2014 through a family lawyer and the details of the scholarship were finalized. Kalida Superintendent Karl Lammers felt Margaret's story was too fascinating not to add a personal touch and he set out to meet with Margaret's six children. This past June, lunch was arranged and four of the siblings gathered north of New York City with Mr. Lammers and his wife to share stories of growing up in their busy household and the occasional trips back to Ohio.

The Margaret Holtkamp-Pizzurro Foundation Scholarship will be awarded annually to one graduating KHS senior with at least a 3.0 GPA, who has demonstrated community involvement and great character, and who can express a genuine need for financial support. The complete application process will be announced through the guidance department at a later date. The award will be \$5000 presented annually for the next 15-20 years.
